
Income of Fishing Households before and after Typhoon Haiyan

A Study on Coastal Communities of Batan and Altavas, Aklan, Philippines



- ❖ This study compares the income of fishing households before and after the occurrence of Typhoon Haiyan in the coastal areas of Batan and Altavas, Aklan.
- ❖ Initial data gathering was done with randomly selected fishing households in 2012 using an interview schedule. A return visit to the households was done in 2014.

RESULTS



Most households own a fishing boat.

Most households sells marine products.

Some households engage in livestock raising.

Typhoon Haiyan damaged fishing boats, fishing gears, and/or houses of more than 60 percent of the households.

Assistance received after Typhoon Haiyan were mostly Food and Water or Housing Materials. Less than 10 percent of HHs in Batan received fishing gears and/or boat.

61 percent of the HHs reported a reduction in total monthly household income while 68 percent reported a reduction in the monthly household income derived from fishing activities.
