**Cognitive Component (belief)**

Belief on the effect of mariculture operation to the barangay

**Affective Component (feelings)**

Feeling towards having mariculture operation in the area

**Behavioral Component (action)**

Participation in livelihood and leisure activities

Barangay: employment, food security, income, tourism activities, pollution (increase, decrease, the same)

Like or dislike having mariculture operation in the area

Participation in fishing, gleaning; in swimming, playing, and strolling by the shoreline by the members of the family or study participant (before and after the establishment of mariculture operation)
